

# RAISING LONDON CIRCUIT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

## Chapter Summary: Cumulative Impacts



### CUMULATIVE IMPACTS

There are other projects being delivered at the same time as the Raising London Circuit project. Together, these projects have the potential to contribute to cumulative environmental impacts including traffic, noise and vibration, dust, and visual amenity.

Measures would be implemented with the aim of ensuring these cumulative impacts are negligible wherever possible. The expected cumulative impacts are outlined as follows:

TRAFFIC	NOISE AND VIBRATION	DUST	HERITAGE	VISUAL AMENITY
No significant cumulative increase in truck and light vehicle movements.	Cumulative impacts possible due to night works from this and other projects.	No cumulative increase in dust	No significant cumulative impact on heritage places.	No significant cumulative impact on visual amenity.

After construction, there are no anticipated cumulative impacts given that the area retains its pre-construction land use as a travel corridor for vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists. The Project would also facilitate future developments.

### WHAT WE WOULD DO

Key steps we are taking to mitigate potential cumulative impacts include:

- ▶ Liaising with other projects under construction in the area to increase awareness of timeframes and limit impacts where possible.
- ▶ Exploring incorporating additional noise mitigation measures to avoid cumulative noise impacts for the local community.
- ▶ Coordinating management and mitigation measures with other projects (to ensure the measures are effectively working together to reduce potential of cumulative impacts. One example might be practicing respite periods across the projects in order to reduce cumulative impact of construction noise.
